# PRESIDENT, RAI ALI

#### 1. GENERAL UPDATES

#### 1.1 CASA

I am working on joining the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations (CASA) as an observer. CASA is a national voice for Canada's post-secondary students, representing various student associations across the country. This initiative will not only save costs by reducing reliance on third-party vendors but also generate revenue for OTSU by selling our own merchandise. Additionally, it will support Ontario Tech Ridgebacks by offering custom printing services for athletic teams. This project will enhance the services we offer to students and improve our financial sustainability.

During this time, we met with university administration and key stakeholders to establish strong working relationships and align our goals with the broader university objectives. # 1. GENERAL UPDATES

#### 1.1 Onboarding and Training
